#### "Things You Should Know" Excerpt Taken from The RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### Page 5 – Paragraph 4 -THE HOME

(d)- All skirting is to be white split brick, solid brick, matching siding or lattice work. If matching siding or lattice work is used, a border made of material that cannot be damaged by string trimmers must be installed at ground level. All awnings, patio covers, carports, and storage sheds are to be white or a color that matches the color of the home. Newly installed homes must have skirting that prevents animals from gaining access to the home.

The lawn service uses string trimmers to trim around the home where a lawn mower cannot reach. These motorized tools inherently will cause damage to aluminum siding, vinyl siding or any other material that can be damaged.

To protect any type of material that extends to ground level on the home (skirting), it is recommended that a border of 12 to 16 inches be installed. This protective material can be patio pavers, poured concrete, flat concrete "squares" (12" x 12"/12" x 18"), or decorative edging stones. This improvement must be approved by the Association after an Architectural Review Committee (ARC) form is submitted.

If a protective border is not installed and the siding, down spouts or skirting is damaged by the string trimmers, the lawn service and/or TSROA will not be responsible for any damage that may occur.

You can choose how to receive alerts, i.e. a cell phone, landline, text, email. You can also enter multiple methods.


#### Some Good History Here... OVER A BARREL



#### GUIDELINES FOR MAKING A REQUEST FOR IMPROVEMENTS, CHANGES OR ADDITIONS.

All requests to make changes, additions or alterations to or around the outside of your home must be submitted to the office for review.

This form and any accompanying paperwork must be turned into the office no less than 2 weeks prior to the start of work.

Requests must be on the front of this form which asks the following:

- 1. Written description of exactly what is to be done.
- 2. Drawing of proposed work needs to be attached.
- 3. Drawing should show position of home and any existing improvements on lot.
- 4. Description of materials to be used including style, color, etc.
- 5. Proposed construction timetable with proposed completion date.
- Improvements must not infringe, restrict, impede, hinder, obstruct or be in conflict with neighbor's property, common area and set-backs.
- 7. All improvements must be consistent in color and style of existing dwelling.
- 8. Homeowner is responsible for locating and marking underground utilities. Contact Sunshine Dig-Safe at phone number 811.
- 9. Homeowner is responsible for any damage to neighbor's property, common areas, and all underground utilities that have been located/marked or not located/marked.

These guidelines are not inclusive of homeowner responsibilities regarding maintaining or improving your home. Please refer to the Tarpon Shores Rules and Regulations for detailed information.

Project working hours: Monday – Saturday 8 A.M. to 6 P. M. NO SUNDAYS Plumbing working hours: Monday – Thursday 8 A.M. to 2 P.M.

Tarpon Shores is not required to provide City of Tarpon Springs permits. All work that requires a permit (City or County) is the full responsibility of the homeowner and a copy of the permit must be turned into the office.

The jobsite must be kept clean and orderly. All work materials must be removed immediately following completion of the job.

#### ADDENDUM FOR REQUEST FOR IMPROVEMENTS, CHANGES OR ADDITIONS

#### **Special conditions:**

Use caution digging. Many unmarked utility lines are underground such as potable water, irrigation water, electric lines, cable TV lines, etc. These utility lines/pipes are most likely not buried very deep.


Please prepare the area by delicately digging/trenching and identifying where the lines are located prior to the commencement of the construction work. Move any lines that have to be relocated.

Kindly contact the office prior to digging so we can attempt to give you a general idea where the lines are buried. We do not have plans/blueprints to some of the buried utility lines so the park will not be responsible for accurately identifying these lines.

Contact Sunshine Dig Safe at telephone number 811.

Please schedule all work to be done Monday – Thursday. If you break a main line or individual line we may have to contact a plumber and this can get costly if it is after hours. The homeowner who breaks a line is responsible for all payments associated with its repairs.
