When to See the Full Moon in July 2025

July's full Buck Moon will rise on Thursday, July 11, reaching peak illumination at 4:37 P.M. Eastern Time. It will be below the horizon at that time, so plan to look towards the southeast after sunset to watch it rise into the sky.

Why Is It Called the Buck Moon?

The full Moon names used by The Old Farmer's Almanac come from a number of places, including Native American, Colonial American, and European sources. Traditionally, each full Moon name was applied to the entire lunar month in which it occurred, not solely to the full Moon.

The Buck Moon

The full Moon in July is called the Buck Moon because the antlers of male deer (bucks) are in full-growth mode at this time. Bucks shed and regrow their antlers each year, producing a larger and more impressive set as the years go by.

- Around 150 million hot dogs are consumed on Fourth of July. It is estimated that \$6.78 billion will be spent on food this year reported by the National Retail Federation (NRF).
- When the Declaration of Independence was signed in 1776, 2.5 million new people lived in the U.S. Now 243 years later, 327.2 million people live in the U.S. per google 2018.
- Americans spend \$1 billion on fireworks annually. Alabama imports roughly \$19,400,000 according to CNBC.
- More than 14,000 firework displays are put on across the country on July Fourth with Macy's Fourth of July Fireworks Display being the largest in the United States.

- In 1804, the White House hosted its first Fourth of July celebration.
- August 2, 1776 is when most of signers formally signed the Declaration.
- It wasn't until 1938, The Fourth of July was actually declared a federal holiday.
- Dating back to 1785, Bristol, Rhode Island is home to the world's oldest Independence Day celebration.
- The only member of the Continental Congress to formally sign the Declaration of Independence on July 4th, 1776 was John Hancock.
- The Yankee Doodle song was originally written by British army officers in attempt to make fun of backwoods Americans.
- John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, and James Monroe were all United States Presidents who died on the Fourth of July.
- July 4th is also celebrated in the Philippines. The country was recognized as an independent nation in 1946.
- In "Treasure Hunt 2", Nicholas Cage predicted there was a treasure map but the actual message "Original Declaration of Independence dated 4th July 1776" is written upside down on the back of the Declaration of Independence.
- Massachusetts was the first state to declare Independence Day a holiday in 1781.

- Deed restrictions are common in communities with additional amenities for residents, such as pools, gyms and clubhouses.



Recycle Right



When everyone isn't recycling right, entire batches of recycling get ruined and are rejected by the recycling processor. This is because the materials included too much garbage and were contaminated. When this happens, the rejected recycling must be taken to the Pinellas County Waste-to Energy Plant, where it is disposed of as solid waste.

One of the biggest contaminants that ruins recycling is plastic bags. Bags and other "tanglers", such as ribbons, hoses, bubble wrap and clothes are not recycling materials and should not be put in your recycling bin. They get stuck in sorting machines and cause equipment failures. Additionally, when you bag your recycling, it cannot be sorted properly and is considered contamination. If it's not clean, dry or loose in your bin, it's not recyclable and is trash instead.

Return plastic bags to retailers so that they can be recycled, reuse them or throw them into the trash.

Recycle right with Simplify to Five:

- 1. All plastic bottles and jugs, no caps (no Styrofoam, plastic bags or wraps)
- 2. Empty glass bottles and jars, no lids
- 3. Aluminum/steel cans and empty aerosol cans, no lids
- 4. Mixed paper. If you can rip it, you can recycle it.
- 5. Flattened cardboard and cartons When in doubt, leave it out!

GUIDELINES FOR MAKING A REQUEST FOR IMPROVEMENTS, CHANGES OR ADDITIONS.

All requests to make changes, additions or alterations to or around the outside of your home must be submitted to the office for review.

This form and any accompanying paperwork must be turned into the office no less than 2 weeks prior to the start of work.

Requests must be on the front of this form which asks the following:

- 1. Written description of exactly what is to be done.
- 2. Drawing of proposed work needs to be attached.
- 3. Drawing should show position of home and any existing improvements on lot.
- 4. Description of materials to be used including style, color, etc.
- 5. Proposed construction timetable with proposed completion date.
- Improvements must not infringe, restrict, impede, hinder, obstruct or be in conflict with neighbor's property, common area and set-backs.
- 7. All improvements must be consistent in color and style of existing dwelling.
- 8. Homeowner is responsible for locating and marking underground utilities. Contact Sunshine Dig-Safe at phone number 811.
- 9. Homeowner is responsible for any damage to neighbor's property, common areas, and all underground utilities that have been located/marked or not located/marked.

These guidelines are not inclusive of homeowner responsibilities regarding maintaining or improving your home. Please refer to the Tarpon Shores Rules and Regulations for detailed information.

Project working hours: Monday – Saturday 8 A.M. to 6 P. M. NO SUNDAYS Plumbing working hours: Monday – Thursday 8 A.M. to 2 P.M.

Tarpon Shores is not required to provide City of Tarpon Springs permits. All work that requires a permit (City or County) is the full responsibility of the homeowner and a copy of the permit must be turned into the office.

The jobsite must be kept clean and orderly. All work materials must be removed immediately following completion of the job.


