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Why Is The Annual Members' Meeting Important?

The annual members meeting is the forum at which time residents can discuss their concerns and questions on association issues in an open forum. It is your time to let the Board know what you would like to see happen in the coming year as it relates to the operation of the Association, whether it be improvements in the common areas, maintenance issues or any other issue that relates to the association as a whole.

In accordance with the governing documents, the Association is required to schedule an annual member meeting each year. As part of the annual meeting, the election of Directors is held unless the number of candidates submitting their name in nomination is equal to or less than the number of vacancies for that time period. Since amendments to governing documents require a vote of the membership, a Board of Directors will usually try to schedule the vote at the same time as the annual meeting to save on the costs associated with preparing and mailing said amendments.

Unfortunately, this year Tarpon Shores did not achieve a quorum to hold the annual meeting. Although we could not conduct any "official" business the board did open the

floor to members to provide an opportunity for them to ask questions. As there were no substantive issues to vote on, the Board elected not to reschedule the annual meeting to save on the costs of preparing and mailing out the package again.

When next year's annual meeting time rolls around, please complete the proxy that is included with the meeting package even if you plan on attending the meeting. You never know when something might come up at the last minute and you won't be able to attend. At least by submitting your proxy, your vote will be counted.

There are two types of proxies: General proxy, which is used to establish a quorum and there are no substantive items to vote on such as amendments to the governing documents. A Limited proxy is used when it requires the owner to specifically vote on issues that require a membership vote. In that scenario, the proxy holder can represent the owner at the meeting and submit the proxy reflecting the votes as cast by the owner. The proxyholder cannot vote for the owner at the meeting.

January Crime Prevention Meeting



American Bandstand – Resident Spotlight



One, two, three o'clock, four o'clock rock! This was the opening music to American Bandstand, hosted by Bob Horn from 1952-1955, and Dick Clark from 1956-1989. The show started in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on the radio, moving to TV on Channel 6, ABC, airing in black and white, Mondays through Friday, from 3-5:30 PM. It featured

live performances and studio guests, as teens of 14 to 17 years old applauded their favorite singers and musicians. It launched many teen idols, turned people into celebrities, and helped move music up the charts. It was the longest running weekly popular TV show for 37 years. (After 1963, the show moved to California, in color, and finished its run there until the final episode on Oct. 7, 1989.)

Well, if you did not know, there's a cute brunette that lives in this park and she appeared on Bandstand (as it was known in Philly) 3 times. Brenda Burk was born and raised in Philly. She was a teacher of French, Spanish and English for 31 years, teaching 6th through 12th grades.

Brenda's dance career started at the age of 3, when her mother enrolled her in a neighborhood ballet school. She continued ballet, but when Bandstand became popular, she would watch it every day after school and learn all the dances that the "regulars" did on the show. She would practice jitterbugging with the banister of the stairs, using that as her partner! At the age of 13, she and her girlfriends decided that they wanted to go Bandstand and dance on the show. They waited in the long lines outside the small studio at 46th and Markets Streets and were able to get in three times. Inside there was a hubbub of activity, with cameras, the "regulars" dancing in front of them, and most of the other teens seated in bleacher-like stadium seating. Every so often, the other teens were allowed to dance on the floor. They danced to jitterbugs, cha-chas, slow songs, the Bristol stomp, the locomotive, and the music of Chubby Checker, Frankie Avalon, Bobby Rydel, Fabian, and many of the Motown groups who were so popular in that era.

One time she was asked to slow dance by one of the regulars, on whom she had a crush...quite the honor!!! She also danced a jitterbug with his brother and appeared in a "Spotlight Dance" with another. That was a very exciting day!

At the end of her freshman college year, she dated a guy for 9 months, when she was 18. Many years later, on a Bandstand Facebook page, she found out that he was a regular on the show. He had never said a word to her...imagine her surprise!

Brenda and her guy, Al Halegoua, live at 191 Royal Palm. It turns out that Al also danced at Bandstand three times, at about the same time! Brenda's hobbies include tennis, pickleball, and dancing with Al at the local American Legions, Elks, and Eagles clubs. She also enjoys country line dancing, which she taught for 5 years after school for her school district's wellness program. If you would like to see her and Al in action, just come to a dance and you will experience their perfection as they glide across the floor.

All requests to make changes, additions or alterations to or around the outside of your home must be submitted to the office for review.

This form and any accompanying paperwork must be turned into the office no less than 2 weeks prior to the start of work.

Requests must be on the front of this form which asks the following:

- 1. Written description of exactly what is to be done.
- 2. Drawing of proposed work needs to be attached.
- 3. Drawing should show position of home and any existing improvements on lot.
- 4. Description of materials to be used including style, color, etc.
- 5. Proposed construction timetable with proposed completion date.
- 6. Improvements must not infringe, restrict, impede, hinder, obstruct or be in conflict with neighbor's property, common area and set-backs.
- 7. All improvements must be consistent in color and style of existing dwelling.
- Homeowner is responsible for locating and marking underground utilities. Contact Sunshine Dig-Safe at phone number 811.
- Homeowner is responsible for any damage to neighbor's property, common areas, and all underground utilities that have been located/marked or not located/marked.

These guidelines are not inclusive of homeowner responsibilities regarding maintaining or improving your home. Please refer to the Tarpon Shores Rules and Regulations for detailed information.

Project working hours: Monday – Saturday 8 A.M. to 6 P. M. NO SUNDAYS Plumbing working hours: Monday – Thursday 8 A.M. to 2 P.M.

Tarpon Shores is not required to provide City of Tarpon Springs permits. All work that requires a permit (City or County) is the full responsibility of the homeowner and a copy of the permit must be turned into the office.

The jobsite must be kept clean and orderly. All work materials must be removed immediately following completion of the job.
